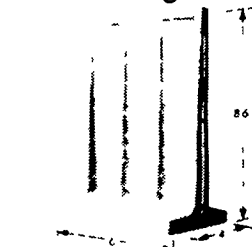

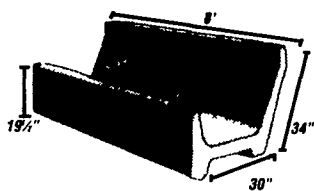

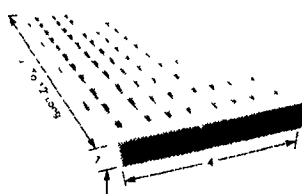
Slant-back J-style Feed Bunker

Keystone Knuckle Beam System helps support pit wall (NCRS approved)



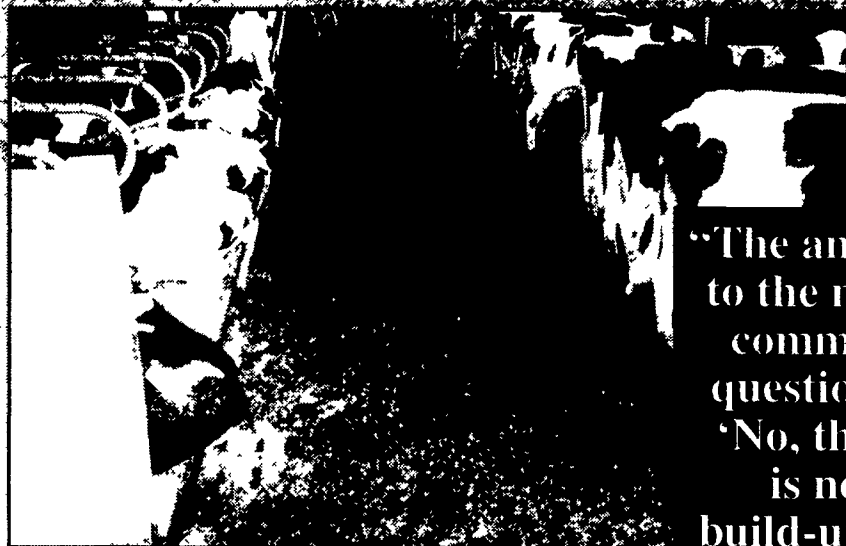

changed our mind, going away from slats because of cost, but that extra cost is worth the first couple years. The one thing I like the most about slats is that there is no expense. I don't have any scrapers or drive units to maintain. I don't have to run around with a pitchfork like we did in the stall barn. The cows' health has been a lot better, and the cows stay much cleaner. Our milk production is up and the somatic cell count has gone down. I give at least some of the credit to the slats because with less moisture on the floor there is less bacteria.
