Weekly summary of southern and eastern U.S. direct feeder pig prices on a FOB farm to farm basis for the week ended July 6. Receipts this week 33,868; last week 35.025. Compared to last week, early weaned pigs and 45-50 pound feeder pigs 1.00 higher per head, 40 pounders steady. Demand moderate for moderate offerings. Receipts included 23,535 pigs shipped to Iowa and Central U.S.

Prices follow for estimated 50-54% lean value pigs by lot size, head count, prices per head with weighted average prices in parentheses.

EARLY WEANED PIGS, 10 LBS. BASIS: 250 or less: 835 head, 28.00-36.04 (32.23); 250-750: 2390 head, 27.19-37.18 (31.57); 750 or more: 7200 head, 30-32.00 (30.60). Total Composite: 10,425 head, 27.19-37.18 (30.95).

Prices are quoted on a per head basis "picked up" at the sellers farm in NC. SC, GA, TN, KY, AL, MS, AR, MO, TX, OK, KS, IN, OH, MI, CO, UT and WY. Prices do not include freight or broker fees. Many lots of 40-60 lb weight pigs sold with a .25 or .40 per pound slide. Also, some lots of early weaned pigs have a 1.00 per pound sliding value adjusted from a 10 pound basis. Early wean pigs under 19 day old.

Estimated lean value is projected to base slaughter weights with normal confinement feeding conditions.


