Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was mostly moderate and sufficient in keeping seller offerings of 3 pound and lighter sizes in good balance to well cleared. Heavier sizes were at least adequate. Live supplies were at least moderate; weights were in a full range but mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 57 to 71 cents. Trade sentiment was at least steady. In the parts complex, bone-in breast, drums and thighs were in close balance and clearing well. Boneless skinless breast were in heavy supply and slow to clear. Wings were fully adequate.

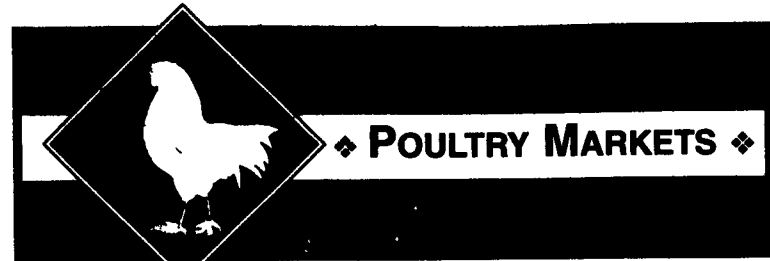
