The Ayrshire grand champion was a senior 3-year-old owned by Nevin Hostetter of Rockwood -Justa Tri Kandy Kane. Hostetter's senior 2-year-old named Nevins Joy was the reserve champion.

In the Brown Swiss breed, Justin Foreman of Rockwood had the grand champion with Swamp Creek Nellie, shown in the 6-years-and-older class. The reserve champion Brown Swiss wasowned by Seth Foreman of Rockwood. It was a junior 2-year-old named Swamp Creek Candy.

Kevin Bittner of Berlin had the Guernsey grand champion with a senior 2-year-old named BF Trumpet Becky. Reserve champion Guernsey was Cloverdale Jessie, a spring calf owned by Kara Savage of Salisbury.

Pineybrook Sabre Rizz-Red, a senior 2-vear-old owned by Cassandra Knepper of Markleton, was the Red and White grand champion. Knepper also had the reserve champion Red and White with a 5-year-old named Pineybrook Redstar Cindy-Red.
