The PCC/PSU Summer Institute is an educational forum for Pennsylvania high school and college age youth. Summer Institute utilizes a workshop and idea exchange format to educate youth about the way cooperatives do business. Each year guest speakers present workshops on current high profile issues, such as biotechnology, genetic engineering, rural/urban interface and agricultural economics.

The program is sponsored by the Pennsylvania Council of Cooperatives and Penn State University's Cooperative Business Education Program. PCC and PSU also sponsor youth selected from Summer Institute to attend the National Institute of Cooperative Education.

At Summer Institute, they helped form, name and operate one of four mini-cooperatives to sell a product or service during the institute. Four group of teens were owners of the MINICO and had an active role in the success of the business.

Special guest speaker Secretary of Agriculture Sam Hayes discussed International Marketing in a workshop with the institute scholars.

Daniel Harnish and Kristina Eshbach were selected to attend the National Institute of Cooperative Education (NICE) which will be conducted in Atlanta, Ga. July 22-26.
