Daily National Grain Market Summary St. Joseph, MO July 23, 2001 Report Supplied By USDA

Grain and soybean bids regained some of Friday's sharp losses. Good weekly export inspection figures were reported for all commodities how- ever wheat and bean numbers substantially higher than expected. Wheat 1 to 3 cents higher except St. Louis 2 cents lower. Corn steady to 1 cent higher. Sorghum steady. Soybeans 5 to 12 cents higher.

Light support was seen in wheat bids due to better than expected ex- port inspection numbers last week, up 1.8 million bushels. Trade corrections were made in corn pits after sharp declines were seen Friday.

The 40 million bushel figure for export inspections was a positive factor. High temperatures continued in the Western Corn Belt areas last week and forecast call for more this week. Crops are looking good at this time but triple digit temperatures increase stress levels. A very good overnight export soybean sale was announced but no destination has been confirmed.

Good weekly export inspection numbers also offered strength to bean bids. Grains inspected for export for week ended July 22, 2001: Wheat totaled 15.3 million bushels, up 1.8, corn 40.0, down 5.7, sorghum 2.4, up 1.3, and soybeans 9.8 million bushels, up 1.8 million bushels compared to a week ago. Year to Date: Wheat totaled 106.9, up 37.0, Corn 1585.0, down 100.7, sorghum 166.7, down 24.7, and soybeans 951.3, Up 38.1. Crop marketing years begin June 1 for wheat and September 1 for corn, sorghum, and soybeans.
