Oklahoma National Stockyards - Weekly Cattle Summary Compared to last week: Feeder steers 2.00 lower. Feeder heifers steady to 2.00 lower. Steer and heifer calves steady. Demand light to moderate for all classes as several major feedlots have their fill and northern buyers not so plentiful. Quality of feeder cattle plain to average and in

medium flesh conditions. Calf quality plain to average and overall well below last several weeks. Temperatures in constant low 100's with high heat indexes causing buyers to think long and hard about unweaned calves. Weigh-ups average to full. Parts of northern and central Oklahoma received 1-2 inches of rain Saturday. Rains were spotty and much of the state continues very dry with hay selling at premium prices if at all

Receipts this week 10,650; last week 10,818; last year 7940. Supply consisted of 74 percent yearlings over 600 lbs; 21 percent calves and light yearlings under 600 lbs; 5 percent cows and bulls. Heifers comprised 29 percent of feeder and calf supply.
