The principal paper session "E-Commerce and Agricultural Commodity Markets" will ex-

This session will draw together practitioners, researchers and government officials from the U.S. and around the world to evaluate the role of e-commerce in U.S. and international agricultural markets and to define and prioritize a set of policy issues surrounding e-commerce in agricultural markets.
