Wheat bids were mixed but corn and soybeans closed moderately higher follow by weather concerns and a higher soybean market. Wheat bids 3 cents lower to 5 cents higher. Corn 2 to 3 cents higher. Sorghum 3 cents higher. Soybean bids 2 to 6 cents higher, with Minneapolis up much as 10 cents.

Wheat bids were mostly higher after reductions in crop rating for spring wheat. Global supply picture continue to look supportive, but lack of export interest is pressuring wheat market. Corn prices were slightly higher as weather continue to be a market factor this week. Soybeans bids also support by weather and potential for yield losses with hot and dry condition persisting.
