

# Results Of Troy Fair Livestock Sale

**TROY** (Bradford Co.) - Sixty-two hogs, 13 sheep and two steers crossed the auction block at the 2001 Troy Fair held recently. Also sold at the combined livestock and milk auction were 12 gallons of milk from the champion and reserve champions from the youth dairy show.

Prices held steady throughout the sale with the 250-pound champion hog commanding \$4.75 per pound. The champion was raised by Meredith Hennip and was sold to County Recovery Service.

The reserve grand champion hog was raised by Josh Ford. That 240-pound hog was sold to Keystone Cattle Company for \$6

per pound.

Overall, the hogs averaged \$2.83. During the course of the auction, five hogs were donated back to be resold to raise money for a youth scholarship fund. The resale of the five hogs raised over \$1,800.

Four lambs were also resold to raise money for the scholarship fund. Those lambs, donated back by various business, raised \$629.

The 116-pound grand champion lamb was raised by Kayla White. White sold her lamb to Jersey Shore Livestock Sales for \$4.75 per pound.

The reserve champion lamb also weighed 116 pounds. That lamb was raised by Monica Kneller and was sold to Wyalusing Livestock Market for \$4.5 per pound.

The 13 lambs averaged \$2.46 per pound.

Only two steers were sold at the 2001 Troy Fair, averaging \$1.49 per pound. Jade Wood exhibited the grand champion, a

1202-pound steer that was purchased by Hoss's Steak and Sea House for \$1.375 per pound.

Raya Shores showed the reserve grand champion steer. Her steer tipped the scales at 1408 pounds and was purchased for \$1.60 per pound by Williams Oil.

In the milk auction, milk from the supreme champion commanded a high price of \$775. Columbia Cross Roads Equipment purchased the milk from James Banks. Proceeds from the milk auction are divided between the owner of the animal, the owner's

4-H Club or FFA Chapter and the dairy promotion program.

Milk from Renee Shores' reserve champion Brown Swiss brought the second high price. John Bennett Trucking purchased the milk for \$750.

The average price on 12 gallons of milk was \$525.

Three baskets filled with Bradford County products were also sold to raise money for the dairy promotion program. Baskets were purchased by Rockwell's Feed, SPE Inc. and Sunset Ice Cream, bringing in another \$1,000 for the organization.
