Mostly prices were unchanged on yolks, but unchanged to slightly higher on whole and whites when compared to a week earlier. Demand was light to good mostly moderate. Offerings remain limited on yolks. Undertone was steady to fully steady on yolks, steady on whole and improved to generally steady on whites. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending August 18, 2001 were 70% more than the previous week, and 9% more than a year ago.

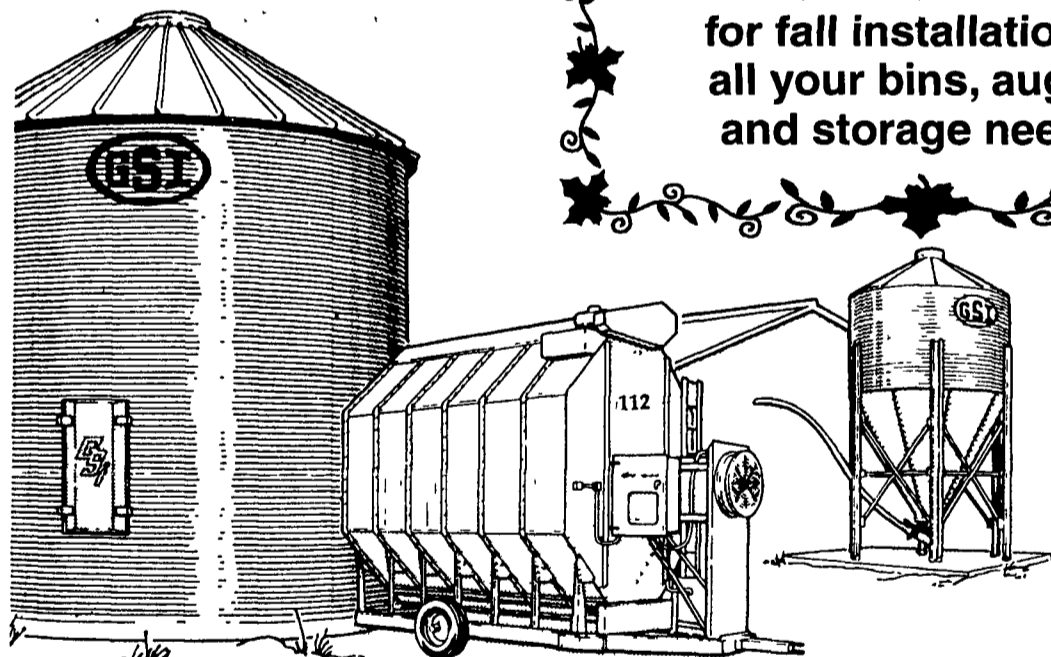
