The giant A-frame compressor measures 15½ feet wide, 26½ feet tall, and weighs 72.5 tons. It was one of the largest of its kind in the world, and was at the forefront of ammonia-based refrigeration.

The compressor is the centerpiece of the museum's exhibit on refrigeration, and the wonderful advances that refrigeration brought.
