

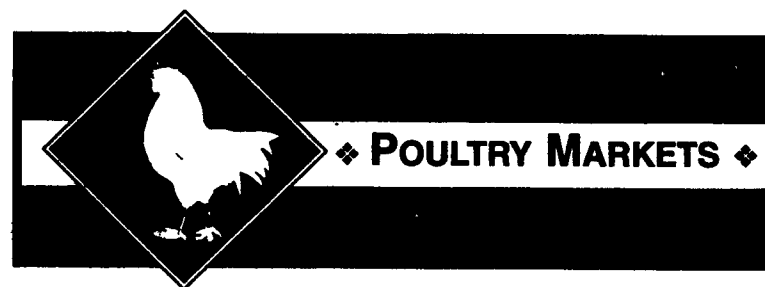

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was mostly moderate. Seller offerings were often noted as tight to well cleared mainly due to plants not processing on the Labor Day Holiday. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights varied from plant to plant in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent higher at 58 to 72 cents. Trade sentiment was fully steady. In the parts complex, both volumes and items offered varied, and product was held with varying degrees of confidence. Wings were in seasonally good demand.
