Grain and soybean bids finished steady to slightly lower. Little new news giving to corn and soybean markets. Fair weekly crop rating numbers this week provided little direction for traders. Wheat bids were mixed 2 cents lower to 2 cents higher. Corn 1 cents lower. Sorghum 2 cents lower. Soybeans 2 to 6 cents lower.

Wheat bids were lower after added pressure from corn and soybean markets. Lack of significant news and poor export interest limiting declines. Corn prices were slightly lower. Crop rating numbers was at 53 percent good to excellent, down 2 percent from last week. Harvest is underway for corn and soybeans lending light pressure to bids. 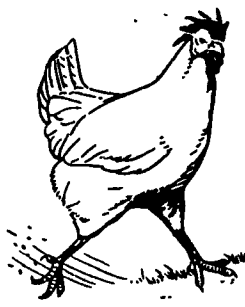
