## **And Manure Nutrients**

Current manure management practices in the nation's animal feeding operations are being evaluated in light of the changing structure of the livestock industry and the quantity, location, and sources of manure

nutrients. This report — using data collected for the census of agriculture by the National Agricultural Statistics Service — estimates the number of confined animals, the amount of manure nutrients, and the capacity of nearby land to assimilate these nutrients.
