Nicholas Ridley, 14, of Shapleigh, Maine, captured the top honors in the Ayrshire show, with RV Willy Jill, first place 3-year-old cow and senior champion as well. Reserve grand champion honors went to DSV Willy Senta, owned by Kevin Before, 18, of Newport, Vt. She was the second place 3-year-old cow. Junior champion honors were awarded to Kelly Burne, 18, of Wakefield, R.I. with her fall calf Sweet Pepper Black Hadley. Reserve junior champion honors went to Wilshore Festus Ho-Ho, owned by Jeanie Graffam, 17, of Falmouth, Maine.

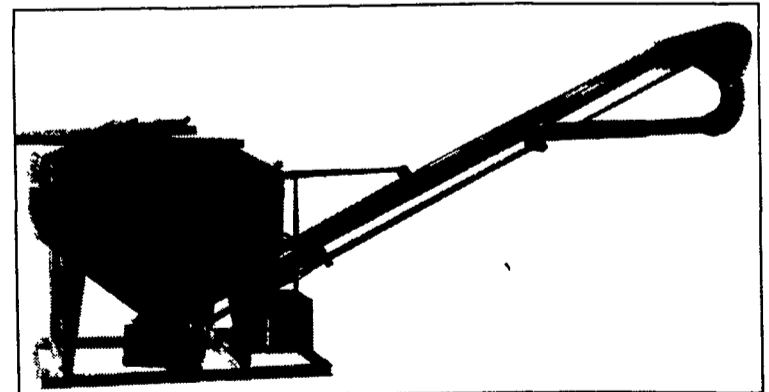
Middlefield, Ct., won the reserve junior champion trophy with Cedar Tree Hot Squirrelie Girl.
