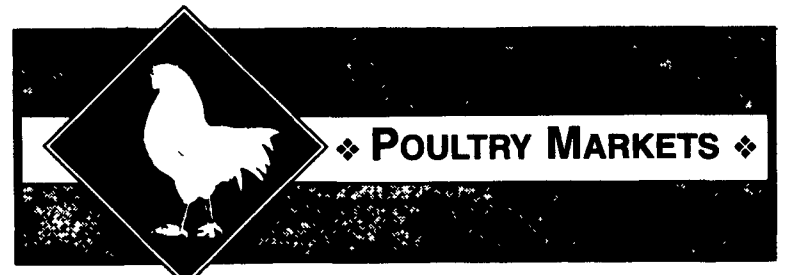

In Boston prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady to fully steady. Demand was moderate to good, better where promotions were in place. Supplies were generally adequate for trade needs. Breaking stock demand was moderate and offerings were usually adequate. Light type fowl were fully adequate for normal processing schedules.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was generally noted as no better than fair with the bulk of activity centered around standing commitments. Offerings were fully adequate to ample. Live supplies were at least moderate; weights varied and were mostly in a desirable range. Processing schedules were moderate. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 55 to 69 cents. Trade sentiment was about steady at best. In the parts complex, all items were at least adequate for the typically lackluster mid-week buying interest. Breast

cuts, wings and boneless skinless thighs were competitively priced in an effort to stimulate activity.
