Trucklot buying activity was mostly fair during midweek trading as dealers remained cautious and unaggressive. Offerings of breast items were available and discounting remained prevalent in an attempt to place product. Legs and leg quarters were at least sufficient. Wings and tenderloins were fully adequate. Movement through distributive channels was light to no better than fair as buyers kept floorstocks closely balanced, and retail movement lacked impetus overall. In addition, the foodservice sector was slow and disappointing as hotel, restaurant and institutional business remained subdued. The market tone was barely steady on wings and tenderloins, no better than steady on the balance.
