Trucklot buying activity was generally light to fair and about as expected for mid-week trading. Offerings of breast items were fully adequate to available with some discounting noted. Leg items were at least sufficient. Wings were readily available and slow to clear. Movement into retail and distributive channels was light to fair at best. The market tone was barely steady to weak on wings and tenders, barely steady on breast items, no better than steady on the balance.

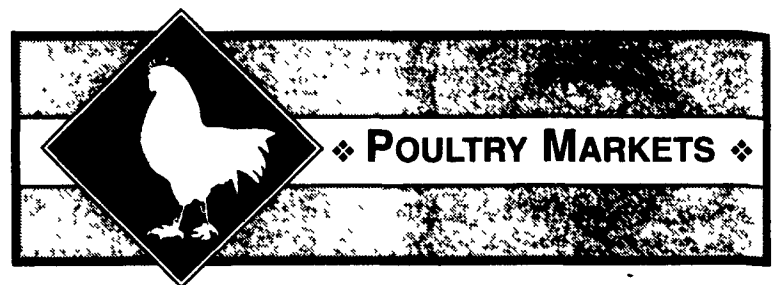

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was generally no better than fair and typical of mid-week. Seller offerings were fully adequate, particularly on the heavier weight sizes. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights varied, and were mostly desirable to heavy Processing schedules were moderate. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 54 to 68 cents. Trade sentiment was no better than steady. In the parts complex, all items were at least adequate for the light and unaggressive buying interest.

Cooperators estimate orders for the week ending October 19, will increase by 7 percent. Present week purchases for the week ending October 12, were 242,119 cases which was 10 percent below the prior week and 1 percent above estimates.

Cases purchased present week: Cartoned 208,350, down 11% from previous week; Loose 33,769, up 3%; Total 242,119, down 10% from previous week.

Comparison figures are compiled on a matched plant basis. Purchases and estimates by 17 cooperators; 30 dozen cases or equivalent.

MARKET AT A GLANCE: In the Southeast, prices were higher on large and medium, but were unchanged on the remainder of sizes. In most other locations, prices were higher on all weights. The market tone was steady to fully steady. Demand ranged light to good, best into limited feature activity. Supplies were adequate to fully adequate, occasionally close for current needs. Breaking stock demand was light to good and offerings were tight to adequate. Light type fowl were fully sufficient for slaughter schedules.
