Offerings were usually tight to short on yolk, adequate on whole egg and sufficient on whites. Demand was seasonal and usually ranged light to moderate. Undertone was fully steady to firm on yolks, steady on whole egg and unsettled to barely steady on whites. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending Oct. 06, 2001 were 4% less than the previous week, and 2% less than a year ago.
