"We think the program is of value, especially with the trying

times farmers are having now," said Dave Smith, at Mid Atlantic Farm Credit. "Opportunity abounds. Many producers are learning to succeed by taking control of their own marketing efforts, and meeting the demands of consumers."

The NxLeveL' training program helps farmers to evaluate strategies such as developing new enterprises and direct marketing, in order to improve farm profitability.

NxLeveL' students include a wide variety of agricultural entrepreneurs, including truck farms,

wholesale growers, and commodity farmers. Courses are adapted region-to-region based on crops grown and marketing outlets.

The new training program was developed with the support of the USDA Sustainable Agricultural Research and Education program. It is available


