Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was limited, and was generally noted as about normal for the period, as buyers look to build floor stocks of turkeys and other items for the upcoming Thanksgiving holiday. Offerings were adequate to readily available. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights varied in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 53 to 67 cents. Trade sentiment remained barely steady to weak. In the parts complex, supplies were adequate to ample and often offered at highly competitive prices in an effort to stimulate buyer interest.

NATIONAL RETAIL EGG PURCHASES REPORT: Cooperators estimate orders for the week ending November 09, 2001 will decrease by 8 percent. Purchases for the week ending Nov 2 were 323,646 cases which was 9 percent above the prior week and 15 percent above estimates.

Cases purchased present week: Cartoned 289,750, up 11%; Loose 33,896, down 2%; Total 323,646, up 9% from prior week. Comparison figures are compiled on a matched plant basis. Purchases and estimates by 17 cooperators; 30 dozen cases or equivalent.

In New York and Philadelphia, prices were higher on the larger sizes and unchanged on mediums. Elsewhere, prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady to fully steady. Demand ranged light to good, best where features were a factor. Supplies were mostly adequate to at times close for full trade needs. In the East, breaking stock offerings were adequate to ample and were barely adequate in the Midwest. Demand was moderate to good. Light type hens were at least sufficient for the light and unaggressive demand.

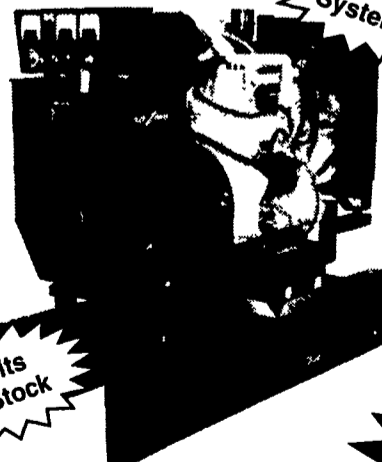

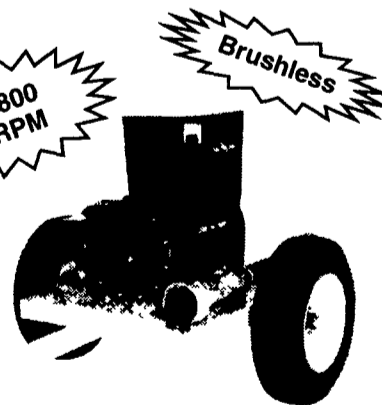
