FEDERAL/STATE: Trade sentiment was about steady in the West, barely steady to weak elsewhere. Retail demand was seasonally slow to fair as interests shifted to more traditional holiday meat items. Food service was slightly better, fair to moderate, good where fast food had successful promotions. Supplies of all sizes were available and attractively priced. In the parts structure, trading was slow to fair with all items at least adequate and discounted. In production areas, live supplies were moderate. Weights were mixed, but mostly desirable.

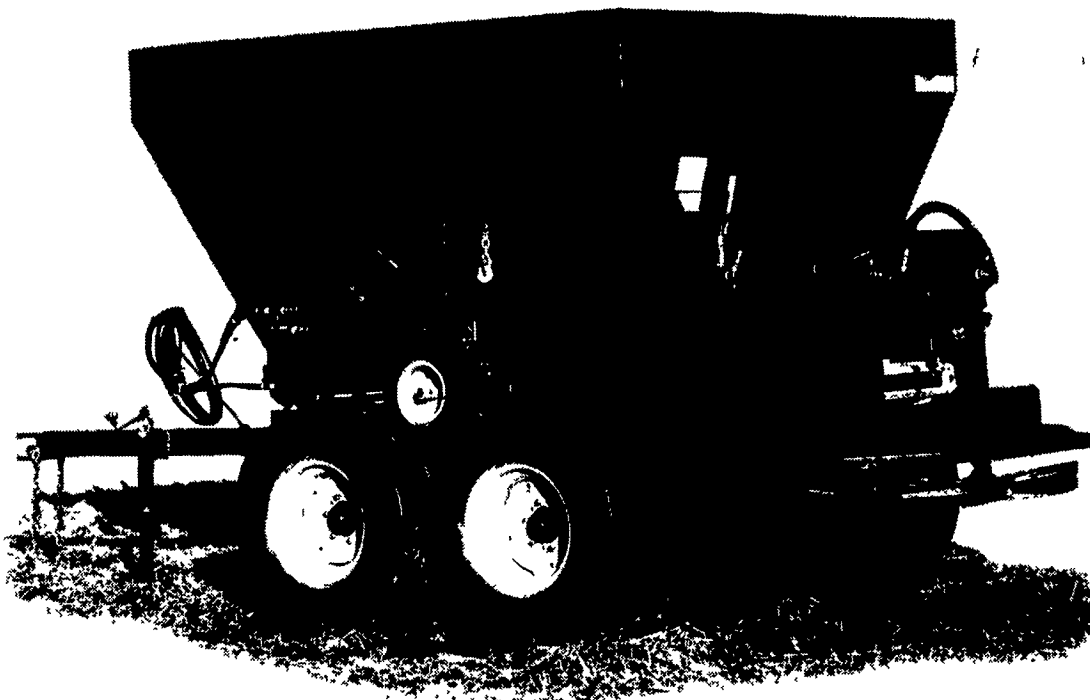
