Daily National Grain Market Summary

Grain and soybeans finished slightly higher. Support stemmed from higher a soybean market and traders positioning before Friday's production report. Improved export demand for all commodities help underpin bids. Wheat bids were mixed 1 cent lower to 3 cents higher. Corn were 2 to 7 cents higher. Sorghum 1 cent higher. Soybeans 5 cents higher with Minneapolis up much as 14 cents. Wheat bids were mixed with another slow day of trading. Weather items are friendly with rains in Argentina and drier weather in most wheat growing areas.

Corn prices slightly higher due to support from soybean market. Light short covering was noted before USDA's production report. Export sales were minimal but Taiwan tender looked to be supportive. Soybean bids closed higher with strength from soybean by-products.
