Eastern Region Frozen Eggs ATLANTA, GA. November 23, 2001 Report Supplied By USDA

Mostly prices were unchanged when compared to previous week's trading. Offerings were generally adequate for the light to moderate demand. The undertone was steady to fully steady on whole and yolk and steady for whites. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending November 17, 2001 were 3% more than the previous week, but 3% less than last year.




