Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending November 17, 2001 were 3% more than the previous week, but 3% less than last year.

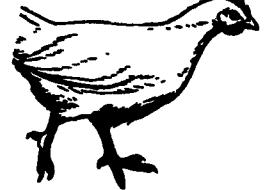

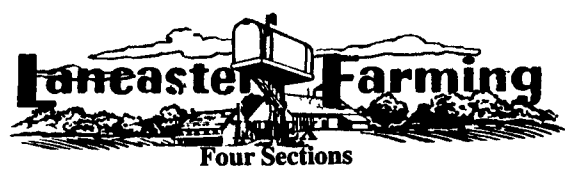
