NATIONAL YOUNG TURKEY PARTS AND BULK MEAT, Frozen, unless specified, cents per lb, delivered first receivers, part and full trucklots, as of Nov. 27, 2001.

Domestic demand and trading was light as some industry members take a wait and see position while they watch for further market developments coming off the long holiday weekend. Export demand and trading was frozen and centered on tom drums and frozen 15-20% mechanically separated turkey. Export offerings ranged from thigh meat being held with the most confidence to tom drums continuing being readily available. Some fresh thigh meat sold at 73 cents delivered export.

Demand into all outlets ranged light to moderate. Supplies were adequate to available for full trade needs. Breaking stock supplies from regular sources were fully adequate to ample for the light demand. Light type hens were sufficient to fully sufficient for slaughter requirements.

Live supplies were at least moderate; weights were mostly desirable. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 53 to 67

cents. Trade sentiment was mostly weak. In the parts complex, all cuts were at least adequate for the disappointingly light buying interest.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was moderate. Demand was moderate. Live supplies were moderate for plant needs with an estimated slaughter of 1,372,000 compared to 1,370,000 last Tuesday. Weights were desirable. Processing schedules were moderate. Boneless breasts were moderate for the market being reported while demand is light and below average.

Negotiated F.O.B. dock prices, 2 pounds and heavier ice-packed broilers and fryers, trucklot sales of US Grade A or equivalent were steady at .52 - .61 per pound, less than trucklot sales .50 - .70 per pound.

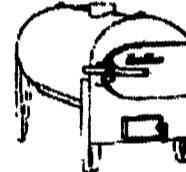
