Movement through retail and distributive channels was seasonal and generally no better than fair overall. The market tone was at least steady on bone-in breasts, about steady on the balance.

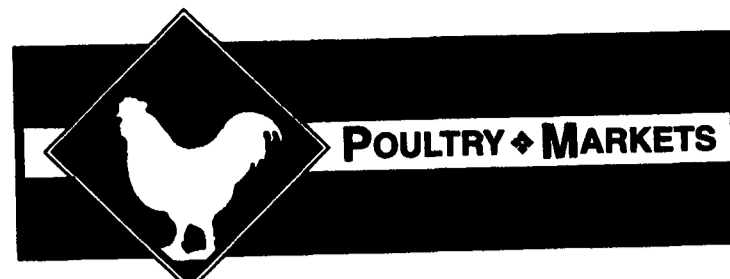
