Trucklot buying activity was fair but unaggressive. Offerings of b/s breasts

were available but slightly improved from early week, bone-in breasts were noted as about adequate to a balanced position. Dark meat cuts were fully sufficient, with thighs reported in the longest position. Wings were generally adequate, although party wings were short. Movement through retail and distributive channels was about fair, and was best for the occasional feature. The market tone was fully steady on bone-in breasts, improved on party wings, and about steady on the balance.

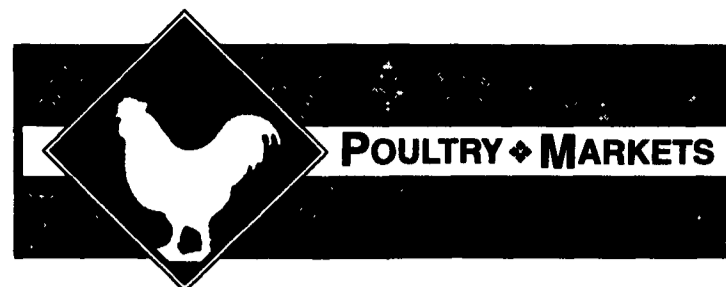

Mostly prices were lower on whole, unchanged to lower on whites and sugared yolks, and unchanged on the balance of items when compared to previous week's trading. Demand was seasonal and reported as light to moderate for usually adequate offerings. The undertone was generally no better than about steady, except for blends which were generally steady. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern

region for the week ending December 01, 2001 were 19% higher than the previous week and 10% more than the same week last year.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was moderate. Demand was moderate. Live supplies were moderate for plant needs with an estimated slaughter of 1,324,000 compared to 1,377,000 last Tuesday. Weights were desirable. Processing schedules were moderate. Actual slaughter for week of 12-3 to 12-7 was 6,813,941, with an average weight of 4.99.

Negotiated F.O.B. dock prices, 2 pounds and heavier ice-packed broilers and fryers, trucklot sales of US Grade A or equivalent were steady to lower at .47 - .56 per pound, less than trucklot sales .45 - .65 per pound.
