Dual prices\* as changes in pricing terms are effective as of today. The market tone was generally steady. Demand into all channels ranged moderate to instances good, best where winter weather increased consumer shopping. Supplies were usually adequate for full trade needs. The New York State shell egg inventory was 5% less and the New Jersey inventory was 29% lower than the previous week.

Dual prices for Philadelphia as changes in pricing terms are effective as of today. In Boston and New England, prices remained unchanged. The market tone was generally steady. Demand into all outlets ranged moderate to at times good. Supplies were usually adequate for full trade requirements. The New England shell egg inventory was 7% less than last Monday. The Pennsylvania inventory was 39% higher, but the Delaware/Maryland inventory was 28% lower than last week. Breaking stock offerings were ample for the light demand. Light type fowl were at least adequate for the fair demand.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was fair to moderate and was generally noted as sufficient in keeping current production well cleared. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights were mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were curtailed today and plants planned to close tomorrow, Tuesday in observance of the New Year. Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent higher at 51 to 65 cents. Trade sentiment

was fully steady to firm. In the parts complex, wings remained short of an active call. Other cuts were at least adequate for immediate needs, particularly bone-in breasts and tenders.
