Trucklot buying activity was light entering the week as dealers attempted to keep floorstocks to a minimum due to Tuesday holiday downtime. Offerings of bone-in breasts were readily available, although, the sharper discounting centered around last week's production. Boneless-skinless breasts were fully adequate. Dark meat cuts were at least sufficient. Wings remained the best item and were short of full needs. Movement through retail and distributive channels was about fair, and was best for the occasional promotion. The market tone remained firm on wings, barely steady on bone-in breasts and about steady on the balance.

Trading was limited with mostly prices unchanged on whites, whole eggs unchanged to lower, and lower on yolks when compared to previous week's trading. Demand was seasonally light and

limited for the available offerings. The undertone was slightly steadier but cautious. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending December 22, 2001 were 7% lower than the previous week, but 14% higher than the same week last year.

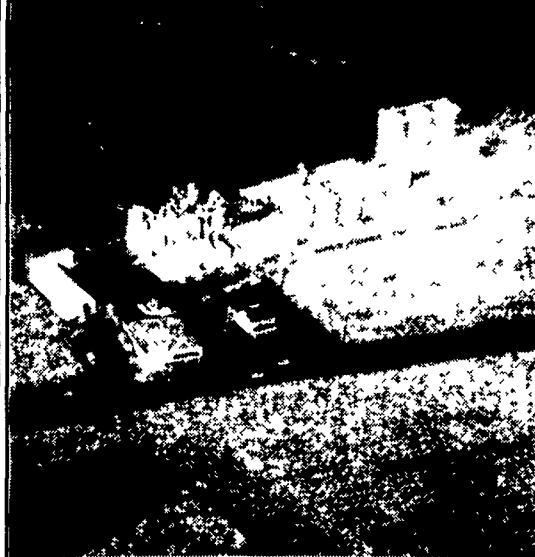
