Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds continued to slow. Seller offerings again varied by both size and volume available, but remained fully sufficient with spot discounting noted on some 3.5 to 4.0 pound sizes. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights were desirable to heavier than desired. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 56 to 70 cents. Trade sentiment was barely steady to steady. In the parts complex, all items were at least adequate for current inquiry.
