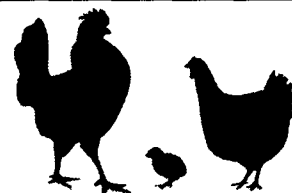
Daily National Grain Market Summary

Light profit taking on the Boards and little new export news kept wheat bids near steady, today. Slightly higher corn bids were influenced by sharp gains in soybean pits. Bean bids turned higher after one day of declines.

Good overnight export purchase was the major support factor in bean advances.
