Grain and soybean bids were mostly lower for the fourth consecutive day. Several CCC donation wheat purchases were reported but other commodities were Slighted. Wheat steady to 2 cents lower. Corn steady to 1 cent lower except Minneapolis 3 cents higher. Sorghum 2 cents lower. Soybeans 4 to 7 cents lower.

Slightly lower wheat bids were underpinned by crop concerns in winter wheat growing areas. Recent warm temperatures and lack of snow cover could mean damage if cold temperatures should settle back into the area.

Corn bids were pressured by continued technical selling on the Board. Additional wet weather is forecast for Southern Brazil this week. Sharp declines were noted in bean pits as spillover weakness from the past three days continued. Export demand remained slow and China talks kept a negative tone in soybean pits

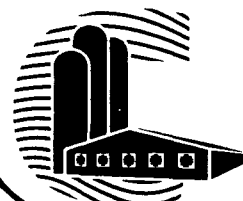
