THIN ICE?

Just because it's February doesn't guarantee that the ice is safe. According to a chart by the American Pulpwood Association, 2 inches of ice thickness will hold one person on toot, and 3 inches is safe for a group if they go in single file. It takes 7° inches to support a passenger vehicle (2 ton gross) and S1 inches for a light truck (2) ton gross). A medium truck (31- ton gross) needs 10 inches and a heavy truck (8 ton gross) needs 12 inches. Keep in mind that river ice is about 15 percent less strong than lake or pondice, and that slushice has only half the strength of blue icc. Always be on the alert for spring thaws, rapidly flowing pond outlets, and

other open water While you re out there on the ice mind the dan gers of the windchill factor, as well. If indoubt stay off the ice and out of the wind'




