I was once accused of trying to build a program for new farmers based only on hope. My reply, of course, was that hope was not enough, but I believe that hope is as vital to new farmers as spring is to a new year.

Offering hope to young people who want to start out in production agriculture seems to scoff at current conventional wisdom. To many, the only way to get into farming is either to marry into it or inherit it. Without a lot of financial help, entry into farming seems hopeless. And every new census underscores the continuing steep drop in new farmer entry. The latest census reveals that there are three times as many farmers age 65 or older as those who are under 35.

While the costs of land, ma-

chinery, regulation, and just doing business keep rising, profit margins continue to slip. Many wonder why anyone would want to invest so much for the privilege of working outdoors in drought, snow, and mud to earn a modest living with no paid vacation or health benefits.

However, there still is a resilient group who

Is there a cookbook recipe for their success? Not really, but these farmers exhibit the following characteristics:

• They work to reduce costs and increase profits while protecting the natural environment and supporting their local communities. In other words, their focus is on working with nature rather than against it.

• They focus on value rather than cost and try to tailor their products to the unique needs and preferences of their customers, instead of trying to fit the customer to their product.

• They market in the niches, they direct market their product using everything from the Internet to word of mouth to advertise their services.

 They focus on what they do best, capitalizing on their unique skills and abilities. They find markets for the crops or livestock they want to grow and are able to grow well rather than produce for markets where they have difficulty competing.

• Last of all, they focus on creating value through their uniqueness.


