Forecasts call for a substantial amount of snow in many winter wheat growing areas which eased concerns over crop damage. Additional hquidation was seen in wheat pits again today. Light export demand overnight offered no support to wheat. Corn bids were narrowly mixed. Light support came from Taiwan's overnight corn order. Declines in soybean bids, limited advances in corn bids. Beans remained under pressure by continued rain in South American.
