In Boston, prices were unchanged to 2 cents lower on extra large, unchanged to 3 cents lower on large, and unchanged on mediums. The market tone was barely steady to weak. Demand was mostly light to moderate, slightly better where features were advertised. In the Philadelphia area, large eggs were on special for buy one dozen and get one dozen free. Supplies were available for current trade needs. Breaking stock offerings were sufficient for the light demand. Light type fowl were adequate to fully adequate for processing requirements.

Wings were readily available. Movement through retail and distributive channels was seasonally slow. The market tone was barely steady to weak on wings, barely steady to instances weak on bone-in breasts and no better than steady on the balance.

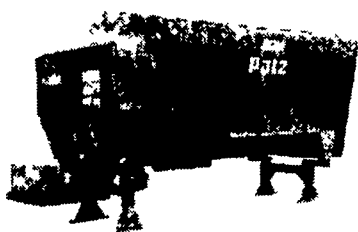

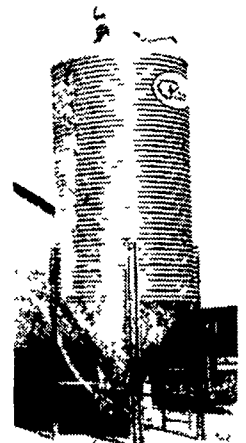

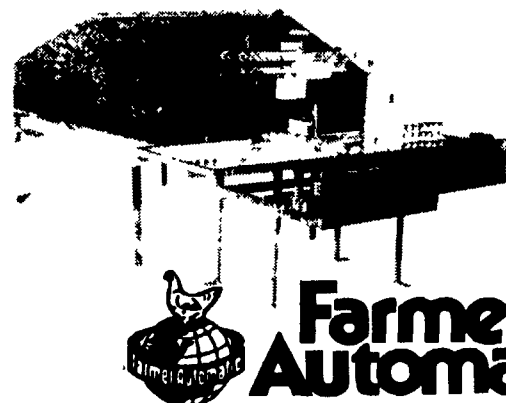
