Southern And Eastern US Direct FOB Feeder Pig Report: Weekly summary of prices on a FOB farm to farm basis, week ended Feb. 15: Receipts: 39,577; last week 33,212. Compared to last week: early weaned pigs and 45-50 pound weights steady to 1.00 per head lower; 40 pounders 1.00 higher. Demand good for moderate offerings. Receipts include 24,380 pigs shipped to Iowa and Central U.S.

Many lots of 40-60 weight pigs sold with a 25-40 per pound slide. Also, some lots of early weaned pigs have a 1.00 per pound sliding value adjusted from a 10 pound basis. Early wean pigs under 19 days old. Estimated lean value is projected to base slaughter weights with normal confinement feeding conditions.

Eastern Cornbelt Direct Sheep Weekly Report (includes lambs sold in IL., IN., OH., MI.) — Compared to last week slaughter lambs were 2.00 higher. Slaughter ewes steady. Demand for lambs was light to moderate for a light run and slow trading activity. Receipts are running moderately below a year ago, and prices are 15.00 less than last

year. Carcass lamb prices were mostly 1.75-3.75 higher than last week, with carcasses under 45 lb 4.25 higher. Confirmed sales this week about 55% lambs and 45% slaughter ewes, with an additional 575 goats. Total sheep and lambs sales: 750; last week 1075; last year 1100.
