Trucklot buying activity was noted as mostly fair and typical of midweek trading. Offerings of boneless-skinless breasts ranged adequate to better balanced. Bone-in breasts were at least sufficient. Leg quarters had increased in availability and dark meat cuts were fully sufficient. Wings remained ample and discounted. Movement through retail channels was noted as fairly good as active features spurred additional refill demand. Distributive draw was generally fair to no better than moderate. The market tone was barely steady to weak on wings, barely steady on leg quarters and about steady on the balance.

Mostly prices were lower on yolks and unchanged on the remainder of items when compared to previous week's trading. Demand was light and unaggressive. Supplies were at least adequate for current trade requirements. The market tone ranged barely steady to weak and trade sentiment was unsettled. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending February 09, 2002 were 5% lower than the previous week but 10% higher than the same week last year.
