BLOWING IN THE WIND

ne weather fore of March says, 'In like a lion and out like a lamb," or vice versa. The blustery winds of March usher in the warmer spring weather. At about 39 miles per hour, however, blustery winds can become a damaging force. In 1806, Admiral Sir Francis

Beaufort of the British Navy devised wind velocity scale, which described a wind between 39 and 46 miles per hour as a fresh gale. According to Beaufort's Scale of Wind Speeds (now used by the National Weather Service in a slightly modified form), wind speeds of more than 73 miles per hour are classified as hurricanes. In between the fresh gale (or gale) and the hurricane are the strong gale (up to 54 mph) the whole gale (or storm up to 63 mph), and the violent storm (up to 73 mph)


