The trade sentiment was fully steady to firm in the Southeast, steady to fully steady in the Midwest, and mostly steady in the Northeast. Demand was in a full range of light to good with the best movement centered around feature activity. Supplies were irregular, but usually sufficient and remained confidently held. Breaking stock demand was light to moderate for adequate or available offerings. Light type fowl were adequate to fully adequate for current processing schedules.

Mostly prices were unchanged on whites, but unchanged to lower on the remainder of items when compared to previous week's trading. Demand and trading were very light and limited. Supplies were adequate for current trade requirements. The market tone was unsettled to barely steady on yolks and generally steady on whole and whites. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending February 16, 2002 were 1% lower than the previous week but 1% higher than the same week last year.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was moderate and clearing the market at a reasonable rate. Demand was moderate with average buyer interest and trading. Live supplies were moderate for the market being reported with an estimated slaughter of 1,377,000 compared to 1,174,000 last Tuesday. Weights were desirable. Processing schedules were moderate. Supply and demand of bone in breast were moderate for the market being reported with additional pallets being ordered and rapidly absorbed. Actual slaughter for the week of 2/18-2/22-2002 was 6,551,727 head with an average weight of 4.89.

Negotiated F.O.B. dock prices, 2 pounds and heavier ice-packed broilers and fryers, trucklot sales of US Grade A or equivalent were steady at 47 - 58 per pound; less than trucklot sales 47 - 67 per pound.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds remained light to no better than fair. Seller offerings were fully adequate to ample with 3.5 and 4.0 pound sizes offered at highly competitive prices in an effort to stimulate buyers interest. Live supplies were at least moderate, weights were mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 50 to 64 cents. Trade sentiment was barely steady. In the parts complex, breast items were short of buyer needs. Leg items and wings continued to be readily available and generally slow to clear.
