Tom bulk parts trade sentiment on drums was steady to fully steady, full-cut wings mostly steady, and necks were barely steady at best Demand on bulk parts was slow to instances moderate with the best interest noted drums for export Offerings of tom drums were tight to adequate and held with varying degrees of confidence, full-cut wings light to adequate with offers the least available in the East, and necks were adequate to ample. Frozen thigh meat supplies were held with confidence with some reluctant to offer out at current price levels Some spot weakness was noted on destrapped tenderloins with fresh trading and offers of frozen noted at lower trending price levels Trading centered on a heavy volume of fresh 15-20% mechanically separated turkey for domestic shipments, balance light
