The market tone was firm for white eggs and steady on browns. Demand into all outlets was moderate to good, best where features were in progress. In the Philadelphia area, large 18-count eggs were on special for buy one get one free. Supplies were adequate to close for current trade needs. Breaking stock offerings were adequate to barely adequate for the moderate demand. Light type fowl were sufficient for processing requirements.

CASES PURCHASED: CARTONED: 254,091 — up 8%; LOOSE: 41,034 — down 2%; TOTAL: 295,125 — up 6%.

Comparison figures are compiled on a matched plant basis. Purchases and estimates by 17 cooperators; 30 dozen cases or equivalent.
