Live supplies were moderate for the market being reported with an estimated slaughter of 1,379,000 compared to 1,357,000 last Tuesday. Weights were desirable. Processing schedules were moderate. Supply and demand of wings are moderate for the market being reported. Actual slaughter for the week of Mar 4-8 was 6,803,786 head with an average weight of 5.04.

Negotiated FOB dock prices, 2 pounds and heavier ice-packed broilers and fryers, trucklot sales of US Grade A or equivalent were steady at 47-.57 per pound, less than trucklot sales 47-.67 per pound.

Demand was generally light and most plants focus filling previous commitments. Supplies were adequate for current trade requirements. Market tone was mostly steady. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the eastern region for the week ending Mar. 2 were 3% lower than the previous week but 4% higher than the same week last year.

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
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
