WASHINGTON, D.C., Mar. 15 - (USDA-NASS) - Total red meat production under federal inspection for the week ending Sat., Mar. 16, was estimated at 876.4 million lb, according to the USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service. This was 2.2% higher than a week ago and 3.2% higher than a year ago. Cumulative meat production for the year to date was 1.1% higher compared to the previous year.
