Green Eggs, No Ham

15 eggs

1 cup milk

1 small onion quartered 1/2 green pepper, seeded, halved 10³/4-ounces mushroom soup ¹/₂ cup milk 1 cup Swiss cheese

Put eggs, 1 cup milk, onion, and green pepper into blender. Process at "chop" until onion and green pepper are finely chopped.

Pour into skillet and cook over medium-high heat to scramble eggs. Remove eggs to quartgreased casserole.

Mix mushroom soup and $\frac{1}{2}$ cup milk. Spoon over eggs. Top with cheese. Bake in 350 degree oven for 35-40 minutes.
