On April 24, 1953, British statesman and writer Winston Churchill was knighted by Queen Elizabeth II, making him Sir Winston Leonard Spencer Churchill. That same year, he received the Nobel Prize for literature. Considered a great wartime leader and known for his "bulldog" spirit in hard times against the Nazis, Churchill was a close ally of President Franklin D. Roosevelt, although the two did not always agree. An avid fan of world history, Churchill observed that "when nations are strong, they are not always just, and when they wish to be just, they are no longer strong."

PORTUGUESE KALE SOUP

1/4 pound Italian sausage
1 tablespoon olive oil
2 medium onions, chopped
4 cloves garlic, minced
6 boiling potatoes, peeled and chopped
7 cups chicken stock
1 large bunch kale, stemmed and chopped
salt and pepper



the onions and garlic. Add potatoes and stock. Bring to a boil, and simmer for about 30 minutes until potatoes are done. Puree half the soup for thickening, then pour back into the pot. Add sausage, kale, and seasonings, then simmer for another 10 minutes.

Makes 4 servings.
