Report Supplied By USDA Grain and soybean bids continued as is today with weather and the ongoing Economic problems in Argentina leading the band. Wheat mostly 1 to 2 cents lower except Portland 5 cents higher. Soybeans mixed, 1 cent lower to 1 cent higher. Sorghum 2 cents lower. Soybeans 5 to 8 cents higher.

More rainfall forecast in the Southern Plains remained the major weakening factor in wheat bids. No export announcements overnight for wheat but Tuesday's soft white wheat sale to Egypt still limiting declines.

Corn bids continued to hover around steady with nothing major happening to start a rally. Export interest is still slow this week for corn. Planting delays in the eastern Corn Belt continue as more moisture is forecast. Dryer areas are seeing progress.

A small overnight export sale to Taiwan and the ongoing chaos in Argentina has kept strength in soybeans for the second day.
