NATIONAL CANNER FOWL MARKET: Majority of prices were generally unchanged on the lights and heavies when compared to a week earlier. Offerings were becoming more available but continued to clear satisfactorily. Demand ranged light to moderate. The undertone was cautiously steady.

Cents per pound, current negotiations with out freight cost: **LIGHT CANNER HENS:** Line run without necks: 22-25, majority 23-24. **HEAVY CANNER HENS:** Without necks: 31-38, majority 31-31.5.

NATIONAL YOUNG TURKEY PARTS AND BULK MEAT, Frozen, unless specified, cents per lb, delivered first receivers, part and full trucklots, as of Apr. 23, 2002.

Bulk parts undertone was steady to firm on hen 2-joint wings, steady to fully steady on tom drums, steady to barely steady on necks and mostly steady on the balance of parts. Domestic bulk parts demand and trading was generally light due in part to some industry members attending a poultry conference. Tom drum offerings ranged light to adequate and continued to tighten in some parts of the country resulting in trading at higher trending price levels. Hen 2-joint wing offerings ranged short to light, necks adequate to sometimes fully adequate, tom 2-joint wings ample, balance of items

were adequate for buyers' needs. Livers traded at 20 cents delivered domestic and hen necks at 17 cents delivered export.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was moderate and clearing the market at a reasonable rate. Demand was moderate with average buyer interest and trading. Live supplies were moderate for the market being reported with an estimated slaughter of 1,353,000 compared to 1,399,000 last Tuesday. Weights were desirable. Processing schedules were moderate. Actual slaughter for the week of 4/15-4/20/2002 was 7,056,956 head with an average weight of 4.83.

Negotiated F.O.B. dock prices, 2 pounds and heavier ice-packed broilers and fryers, trucklot sales of US Grade A or equivalent were steady at .44 - .55 per pound, less than trucklot sales .44 - .63 per pound.

The market tone was steady to fully steady on yolks, steady to about steady on whole, and steady for whites. Demand slightly improved, but remained mostly light. Offerings were adequate for current trade requirements. Breaking stock supplies were not as available, however continued sufficient for present requirements. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending April 13, 2002 were 1% lower than the previous week, but 7% higher than a year ago.
